Top 25 questions principals should ask an art applicant.

- 1. Have you interviewed with the Art Supervisor or Fine Arts Director yet?
- 2. Why are you choosing to teach art?
- 3. Why are you interested in teaching art in our district?
- 4. What grade levels are you interested in teaching?
- 5. Did you bring a portfolio with your educational philosophy, lesson plans, student works, and your artwork?
- 6. Describe your educational background and teaching experience.
- 7. Explain to me the language and vocabulary of art.
- 8. Can you give an example of when a conflict arose and how you resolved it?
- 9. Describe your student teaching successes and challenges.
- 10. What are your areas of strength and areas you would like to grow as a visual arts educator?
- 11. What type of professional development do you anticipate participating in the district?
- 12. Describe a typical classroom lesson when starting a new concept in the teacher and student perspective.
- 13. How do you incorporate cross-curricular connections in the art classroom?
- 14. How do you incorporate technology in the art classroom?
- 15. How do you differentiate instruction for all levels of students?
- 16. What would I see if I dropped in your class with classroom procedures, material management, clean up, and discipline management?
- 17. What is your comfort level with various art media, equipment and knowledge of safety in the art classroom?
- 18. What is your philosophy on originality for your students' artwork?
- 19. What is your philosophy in displaying student artwork and participating in art competitions?
- 20. What are your strategies for keeping students motivated and engaged?
- 21. What do you want students to take with them when they leave your class?
- 22. What are your approaches to assessing student work?
- 23. How do you advocate for your art program?
- 24. How do you communicate with parents?
- 25. Where do you see yourself in 5 to 10 years?
