It is awesome that the national conference is in Texas this year, but if you have to choose one or the other, choose Texas. Our conference is the largest state conference in the nation and provides as one of its main focuses hands-on workshops with relevant materials that transfer immediately into your classroom. The larger picture is always good, but in the end "there's no place like home."

So "put on your old grey bonnet," "pull up your stakes," "don't let the door hit you on the way out," and come be a "San Antone Rose" with us this coming November. "Resistance is futile" so come "make it so." "Wild horses couldn't keep me away!"

Innovative programs are on the cutting edge to reach our 21st Century learners at the Elementary level.

Multi - intelligences, is a concept we will be exploring at our next conference in November during the Elementary Division meeting. It is a look at how we as teachers can create questions and train our students to be independent thinkers with deep cognitive expressions and reach our diverse students by understanding the differences in their thought processes.

Here is a peek at the 8 Intelligences that will be covered in our November meeting: (Visual/Spatial, Musical/Auditory, Verbal/Linguistic, Kinesthetic, Logical/Mathematical, Interpersonal, Intrapersonal, and Naturalist).

Collaboration is also critical to establish complex thinking, creativity and an impact our students with deep discussion and interaction.

You will be very pleased with some of the decisions made for the VASE event and for the educational process that our students and teachers will participate in as we begin our next season of the competition!

One of the new changes that will occur is that the "No Photography" rule has been removed. The board believes that this is a learning experience for both students and teachers, and the ability to take photos back to the classrooms for teacher's to present as the standard of success to their students is invaluable!

The awards ceremony at the state level has also been revamped! We feel that all the attendees at the state event

are HUGE WINNERS, and therefore they will be celebrated as they begin their day at the state event! A huge celebration and "Olympic style" opening ceremony will be added to the state event. Collaborations

2nd Annual Summer Summit. Members of Higher Education have revved up their collaborations this summer. They met in June Austin to talk about the challenges to Texas art teacher preparation programs and courses. Hosted by the University of Texas at Austin, the 2nd annual Summer Summit session proved to be a kick-back-and relax venue for art education faculty from across the state to continue the dialogue that begins in the fall. Members are encouraged to step into the research spotlight at the 2012 TAEA fall conference in San Antonio. Higher Ed faculty and grad students may collaborate to present sessions.

Service Learning. Artist, Naomi Natale, hired Kara Hallmark of UT Austin to be the Texas coordinator for the One Million Bones Project in 2013. **One Million Bones**

is a large-scale social arts project, which employs service learning education and art making to raise awareness of the atrocious genocides that are occurring around the world today. Kara's goal for the project is to work with Texas art classes, groups, and organizations to create 10,000 ceramic bones for the performance display at the capital this fall.

Sign-up to create your own bone(s) in the **Students Rebuild challenge, A Path Forward**. Every bone created generates a \$1 donation, up to \$500,000, to CARE, for their work on the ground in Somalia and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. You can hand make bones yourself of clay or biodegradable material or you may have a bone made in your name for a donation of \$5. Bones created for you will be placed in your honor on the National Mall.

General Session Speakers for the San Antonio 2012 TAEA Conference



Vincent Valdez (Friday)

American, born 1977, San Antonio, Texas Valdez grew up in San Antonio and demonstrated talent for drawing at an early age. As a young muralist, he began exploring imagery that pertained to social/political statements. Vincent received a full scholarship to The Rhode Island School of Design where he earned his BFA in 2000. In 2004 at age 26,

Stations, Valdez's suite of monumental charcoal drawings, was shown at the McNay Museum in Texas. He was the youngest artist to have a solo exhibition at the McNay. He has made prints with Hare and Hound Press, Self Help Graphics, and the Serie Project of Coronado Studios. Exhibition venues include: The Los Angeles County Musuem of Art, The Snite Musuem of Art, The Frye Museum, The Mexican Museum Chicago, The Parsons Museum in Paris, The El Paso Museum of Art, OSDE Buenos Aires, Laguna Art Museum and others. A recipient of the Skowhegan School of Painting '05 and The Vermont Studio Center '11, Valdez lives and works in San Antonio, TX.



Todd White (Saturday)

Born in 1969 in Texas, he came from humble roots. During his twenties he relocated to Hollywood and worked in the animation field, developing characters at some of the most renowned production studios in the country. He was even part of the lead team for the international hit cartoon series SpongeBob SquarePants. During this period Todd started to forge his artistic style by experimenting with style and concept. Hands are a focal point as he's always been impressed by how powerfully and expressively tiny gesticulations can amplify an actor's performance. "Everyone's hands are full of personality," says Todd, "They reflect the subject's state of mind almost as much as facial expressions." Subconsciously, he spends his life people-watching scribbling down

sketches whatever the situation (often on napkins, even tablecloths) to record an idea for his next work. Beneath the exaggerated features and textured skin of his characters there is truth. Both theirs and ours. He was chosen from hundreds of

artists as the Official Artist of the GRAMMY® Awards in 2007, the world's most prestigious music event. And in 2009, Todd was invited by Warner Bros. to contribute to a major design exhibition celebrating the 70th Anniversary of The Wizard of Oz. Todd collaborated with Coca Cola in 2010 to produce limited edition bottles and cans. His unique box signature appears right on the product, which is the first time Coca-Cola has given credit to a fine artist in this manner. In 2011 Todd was awarded one of the United Kingdom's most prestigious accolades in the shape of the

Diana Princess of Wales Gold Medal, after donating his portrait of the Princess to the Diana Awards charity. Only 11 people to date, Todd now included as the only American, have been honored with the Award. Todd flew to London to officially receive the award. Following a string of record-breaking shows in the UK, Todd returned to the US to even greater acclaim, and has become one of the worlds most collectable and successful living artists.

As an instructor for the Department of Human Communication and Theatre at Trinity, and a member of Actors' Equity Association, Sam's career in the professional theatre and arts education spans close to 40 years. 1. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Relating to Students – Key to Student Success In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator sees developing relationship with students as key to student success. Students know they are cared for with risk factors removed. Students care about learning because teacher cares about them with the student/teacher relationship based on mutual respect. The teacher is a facilitator rather than dictator and advocates for his/her students and program. Genuine interest is taken in student interests and activities.

2. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Building an Effective Classroom Environment In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator builds an effective classroom environment. The room is organized, but functional, and is instructionally specific with the room arrangement related to assignments. The room could appear as organized chaos as students direct their own learning. It contains samples of historical, professional, exemplary student, and career idea artworks. Safety concerns are evident and visible within the organization of the classroom and students are given choices within the safe environment.

3. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Integrating Across the Curriculum In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator successfully integrates across the curriculum. Accomplished curricular by tying art to core norms in writing, vocabulary, measuring, environmental science, etc. and by teaching other content teachers how to incorporate art into their curriculum thereby creating student relevance. Accomplished through enhancing school climate by taking part in fine arts and spirit events.

4. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Process and Technique

In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator teaches process and technique through the creation of art. Scaffolding is used to teach process and teaching is differentiated for different student learning styles. Also, traditional art methods are deconstructed and constructed for further scaffolding. Many different teaching strategies are used: teacher demonstration, guest speakers, field trips, samples, etc. Students are encouraged to self-discover and then their findings are celebrated. They are given casual exploration time provided with formative checking without the pressure of summative assessment. There are no cookie cutter projects; both process and product are utilized for the students to examine, explore, express, and evaluate.

5. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Establishing a Collaborative and Collegial Environment In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator establishes a collaborative and/or collegial environment between teachers and students, and students and students. The art room is a safe environment that allows communication; agreeing to disagree, exploring, discovering, and trying. The teacher is a guide or facilitator who leads students to destinations. The teacher keeps it "light" – learning to laugh and using a sense of humor. There is a climate of mutual respect as students are people – not lesser beings. The teacher shows students their own artwork and has students observe them working. Students are encouraged to create their own rubrics and criteria and peer collaboration and tutoring is welcomed and encouraged. The teacher creates quality questions – giving students ample time to reply – then probes farther to encourage deeper thinking. Instruction is not limited to just the art classroom but is found in other disciplines and in the community.

6. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Creative Thinking

In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator applauds creative thinking rather than mimicry and there is differentiation for unique results. Students are encouraged and expected to look outside their comfort zones and approach things in new ways to stretch them for growth and positive feedback is given to encourage. Open-ended projects and different types of materials are provided to help students stretch. There are student-led changes and

teachers welcome and celebrate student discovery. Brainstorming strategies are encouraged and teachers help students make connections with their own experiences for authentic instruction.

7. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Establishing and Reaching High Standards Through Assessment & Pedagogy

In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator establishes high standards with ongoing formative, summative and authentic assessment – enabling students to set and reach high goals. Teachers provide a balanced curriculum – teaching the TEKS but then extending them. Creativity is cultivated and arrangements are made for thoughtful engagement with art. Connections are made for relevance so that students develop a healthy global world view. Learning is student-centered and class critiques are positive and productive. Varied pedagogical strategies are used: ask 3 before me, valuate/produce/re-assess, brain-based activities, peer critiques, differentiation, etc. Students are encouraged to be risk-takers and problem-solvers and teachers set high expectations and demonstrate a "can do" success-driven attitude.

8. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Relating the Creative Experience to Everyday Life In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator relates the creative process and problem-solving skills to everyday life. Teachers keep learning real, establishing relevance to produce rigor. Students are encouraged to create artwork that relates to their lives and their cultures. Teachers get to know their students – making relevant connections and valuing their culture and experiences. They motivate their students like a coach and help others see the importance of creativity and the arts.

9. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Actively Engaging the Student

In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator actively engages students at all times. Learning is student-centered (with teacher orchestrating), concept driven, relevant to the student, encouraging, cross-curricular, engaging, student-guided, and teambuilding. The classroom appears as organized chaos as learning is accomplished through communication, collaboration and movement – teacher to student and student to student. Teacher uses communication pedagogical strategies like: think-pair-share, peer critique based on the Critical Method, 100% participation, and differentiation. There are no worksheets or technique practices without application to real artwork. Laughter is encouraged and open-ended projects are used to give students freedom of choice. Expectations are overt or transparent and therefore criteria and guidelines are provided for the student.

10. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Is Positive – Believes in Students

In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator believes in students in a positive way – all students have potential and all start each day anew. Teacher establishes a "Yes You Can" atmosphere – helping students find their unique gifts – and establishes an open-ended approach to learning. Teacher is happy in his/her work with a joyful attitude knowing that a successful and positive attitude starts with the teacher. Teacher is encouraging and celebrates creative problem-solving skills. Order in the classroom is established to maintain peace and safety. Teacher is flexible, forgiving, merciful, professional, positive, encouraging, mentoring, resilient, and has respect for the students, the school, and community.

11. MASTER ART EDUCATOR: Seeks Continuing Development

In this session, learn that the Master Art Educator seeks continuing development in their field – is a perpetual learner. Teachers stay up-to-date because the field of art education is always changing and they must feed themselves artistically to stay fresh, innovative, and creative. Teachers must stay ahead of the curve because they are preparing students for jobs that have not even been created yet so creative problem-solving is essential. The world changes fast in the information age and new research impacts practice and can make the difference in student success. Teachers must stay energized and happy in the profession and must use research and new strategies while keeping what is best of tried and true practices.

Smaller files, especially those saved at a lower resolution, will not be of sufficient quality to properly showcase your work.
