Advocacy is a huge word which all art teachers need to learn and be aware of. It is defined as "public support for or recommendation of a particular cause or policy."

That cause is your job: the teaching of art education!

What have you done in your classroom to promote your program? Do you hang art in the hall? Do you invite your administrators to your classroom to see what your students are creating?

What about the parents of your students? How can they help you? Do you have an "Art Night "that they can attend? An art show they can visit? An open invitation to come to your room and work with their child?

These seem like a lot of questions, but it is up to you to promote what you are doing. It is up to YOU to keep art alive in all schools.

Art does cross all the core subjects. Are you making them aware? We teach math, such as perspective and measurements, science as in mixing paint, writing as in

artistic statements, social studies as in art history and why painters and other artists were doing at that time in history.





General Session Speaker Bridgette Mongeon

Bridgette Mongeon breathes life into clay and bronze. She believes a portrait is more than a likeness; it is capturing the spirit and essence of each person. She is a sculptor, writer and public speaker and loves to share information and inspire others in their business and creative practices.



As a sculptor her specialty is bronze portraits, figurines and awards, architectural and landscapes elements. Her passion for life and her spirit enliven each sculpture. In 2008 her studio tool set expanded to include digital technologies. This extends the range of projects and materials offered to her clients.

As author of "3D Technology in Fine Art and Craft: Exploring 3D Printing, Scanning, Sculpting and Milling" Ms. Mongeon is becoming known as the resource for those things related to 3D tech and architecture, art and industrial design. She co-authored with Mike de la Flor "Digital Sculpting with Mudbox: Essential Tools and Technique for Artists". She enjoys being a contributing writer on "The Digital Biomedical Illustration Handbook." As a freelance writer, she writes for several magazines about creativity, art, business, marketing, technology and faith.

Currently working a new book on 3D technology in fine art and craft, Bridgette loves sharing her process with others who are combining technology with traditional art and craft. This new book documents the art and technology used in creating her monumental sculpture celebrating the 150th Anniversary of Alice in Wonderland.

Featured Local Artists 2017 TAEA Conference

Dandee Danao and Marjon F. Aucoin



Philippines native **Dandee Danao**, better known as Dandee Warhol, is a distinguished figure in the contemporary Houston art circuit. He is recognized as a dynamic collaborator, curator, and visionary. In 2011, he was awarded the Reader's Choice Best Artist of the Year by the Houston Press.

Danao is self-taught and colorblind, two idiosyncrasies that grant his style definition. Familiar with a broad range of techniques and experimentation, he works chiefly with acrylic on canvas. His style exhibits purity of lines, designed geometric patterns, undetectable brushstrokes and arrangement of contrasting colors. Valued for his aesthetic, which draws upon pop art and culture which likens him to Andy Warhol.

Danao founded War'Hous Visual Studios, an art space and assemblage of creative talent providing services including art consultation, design, and curation; such as coordinating eclectic shows showcasing Houston's emerging talents. Recently, he established War'Hous Foundation, enlisting local artists to develop children's art therapy programs.

Marjon F. Aucoin is a Sugar Land-based artist and art educator. She graduated from the University of the Arts in Philadelphia with a degree in Illustration and a focus in Fine Arts. She is a working illustrator and artist, and most recently was published in Spectrum 18: The Best in Contemporary and Fantastic Art.

Marjon serves as the head atelierista at The WIDE School, a Reggio Emilia inspired preschool and elementary. She collaborates with the teachers to provide children with creative experiences meant to enhance and extend their learning. Through the school's art classes, students revisit academic subjects like science, math and literacy and, with the guidance of the atelieristas, express their knowledge and theories through a variety of artistic mediums. The significance of the students' arts education is that it reinforces their classroom learning, while at the same time providing an invitation to creativity that inspires the students to think beyond the lesson and drive their learning further. She also coordinated school-wide projects and organizes the presentations of these projects to the local community.

Lee Carrier



Lee Carrier is a native Texan. She received a BFA from the University of Houston in 2006 and an MED in 2007 also from UH. Carrier taught art education to high school students for 10 years prior to transitioning into her new role as the art coordinator for Cypress-Fairbanks ISD. She also taught a semester at Texas Southern University.

While pursuing her undergraduate degree, she studied the work of Frida Kahlo, which inspired her to paint self- portraits that told truths of her fears and insecurities.

While getting her Master of Education Degree at the University Houston, opportunities to publicly display her art surfaced and as a result she was influenced to create art for communal spaces individually and with the high school and college students she taught.

Carrier has shown work at the Gremillion and Co. Fine Art, Inc., the Community Artists' Collective, Lawndale Art Center, War'hous Visual Studios, East End Studio Gallery, the Art Institute of Houston, Behuman Gallery, Hardy and Nance Street Studios Project Row House and the University Museum at Texas Southern University and have created chalk art murals in the Houston Via Colori Street Painting Festival for the past 10 years. She had a solo show April 2015 at Esperson Gallery.

Featured Local Artists 2017 TAEA Conference

Patrick Renner



Patrick Renner is a native Houstonian. He received his BFA from the Kansas City Art Institute in 2004 and New York State College of Ceramics at Alfred University in 2006 before returning to immerse himself in the Houston scene as a working artist.

In addition to a personal studio, Renner works on large-scale sculpture fabrication from a facility in the East End. This space is the headquarters of Flying Carpet Creative, LLC. which Patrick co-founded in 2015 with Kelly O'Brien, engineering lead. Flying Carpet currently has a temporary 6-story sculpture, Trumpet Flower, on view in downtown Houston, and their first permanent piece, RHYZ, at the Domain Northside in Austin. In development is another permanent piece for Memphis Winridge Park to be completed 2018.

Renner left the public school classroom after a decade to pursue a full time career as an artist. Patrick enjoyed teaching art at the High School for the Performing and Visual Arts and later at the Sharpstown International School, where his students took prizes for their creations in the Houston Art Car Parade, four out of the five years they participated.

He and his wife, artist Emily Peacock, currently co-teach a class about artist practice at Museum of Fine Arts Houston's Glassell School. They have collaborated on their finest work to date with the recent birth of their son. Indiana.

DeeJon - Dandee Warhol and Marjon F. Aucoin

Art can speak loud enough to send a message. As a tool, art can be used to respond to a memory, a current state of mind, or one's own personal beliefs; these are just some of the goals we hope to attain with our students.

DeeJon is an artistic collaboration between two Houston based artists and educators, Marjon F. Aucoin and Dandee Warhol. In DeeJon, the balance between classical and contemporary art is negotiated and ultimately results in an original genre that invites the viewer to step inside the realm of creativity.

In this hands-on workshop, DeeJon will explore the theme of incorporating multiple styles using various mixed media techniques in order to reveal the artist conversation that evokes emotions for the audience. Blurring the lines between realism and contemporary design, you will explore tape techniques, positive and negative forms of design elements, balanced composition, and technical drawing techniques.

DeeJon will also provide tips on how to encourage your students to explore their sense of self and to use art to send a message. Some of the topics that we will cover will be:

- *Exploring emotions through shapes and color.
- *Using font as a textural and symbolic element.
- *Creating a balanced composition.
- *Personal images that inspire us to create collaboratively.

Lee Carrier

Sometimes getting art students to organize their ideas becomes overwhelming because they struggle with implementing several concepts to create a project.

Join artist and muralist Lee Carrier in a hands on Artistic Supersession to investigate ways to motivate students.

Carrier will share tips on collaging and enhancing images with embellishments of mixed media materials such as rust, ink, acrylic, found paper and wood in order to promote creativity and individuality in the classroom.

She will demonstrate how to encourage your students to organize their thoughts and research resulting in the production of original works of art.

Lee's personal artwork consists of the theme "*Tribes and Tribulations*", a result of researching tribal women throughout the globe. Carrier uses symbols of "tribulations" to represent many concepts recreated and reimaged based on womanhood, beauty and strength to assemble a "modern tribe" of women. Her blended work represents the resilience and diversity found among the decedents of indigenous people around the world.

Patrick Renner

Painting Party - Unleash Your Creativity

Join native Houstonian and sculptor, Patrick Renner as he conducts a *Painting Party* workshop.

Participants will engage in a mock version of the activity Renner uses to generate the brightly- colored sculptures for which he is well known. Patrick currently has a temporary 6-story sculpture, Trumpet Flower, on view in downtown Houston.

People will unleash their creativity by painting strips of wood that will then be woven into a large basket-like abstract sculptural form.

Patrick will share and discuss ways of translating this activity to the classroom with participants.

*participants are encouraged to dress accordingly, in the unlikely event that paint gets transferred to clothing accidentally.
