Lesson Plan for Grades K-12









Design: Create miniature polymer clay beads, charms, icons, letters, etc. Bake to harden.



Construct: Arrange personal beads and charms with bead assortments onto a piece of adhesive felt. Stick in place.



Decorate: Cover with a light coat of glitter glue or pouring medium to seal beads in place

Beads take the spotlight as a medium for expression and storytelling.

Using a mixture of self-expressive and manufactured beads, students create low-relief collages that sparkle and shine.

FLATBED PRESS - Drypoint Printmaking

Hands On workshop at local Austin Gallery and studio. Students will learn and experiment with the Drypoint printing process. Drypoint is an intaglio printmaking technique where an image is created by scratching a design directly into a plate with a sharp needle-like tool. This creates a burr, a raised ridge of metal alongside the incised line, which holds ink and produces a characteristic velvety or fuzzy line when printed. All supplies will be included with the price of your workshop..

FLATBED PRESS - Monotype Printmaking

Hands On workshop at local Austin Gallery and studio. Students will create monotype paintings on plates using drawing and painting techniques with tools that range from paintbrushes and brayers to cotton balls and cut-out stencils. All supplies will be included with the price of your workshop.

THE JEWELER'S SAW - Wax Carving Techniques

Wax Carving- Students will spend the time in class learning how to create a wax ring model. We will do the casting process for them. Casting grain and Shipping is Separate, students must pay for a certain amount of casting grain based on the weight of the model they create, we will remove the sprues and tumble the pieces to finish them and ship these out to students. One to two weeks after their course has ended, they students will receive their finished piece in the mail!

JEWELER'S SAW – Silver Stacking Rings
